Annual Report of FY 2021 2021年度 年次報告

(2021年5月1日～2022年4月30日)

2021年度は、前年度から新型コロナウイルス(Covid-19)の影響が強く残り、長期に渡る緊急事態宣言とまん延防止等重点措置により、会員総会をはじめ定例会、イベントなどは一部を除いてすべてがオンライン開催又は中止の止むなきに至ることとなりました。百周年記念事業を含めイベントの開催総数は28と2021年度の31を若干下回りました。

その一方でワクチン接種の拡大等により新型コロナウイルスの影響は漸く沈静化する見通しが見えてきたのは嬉しいニュースです。特に6月1日にグランドハイアット東京にて行われた安倍晋三、ラーム・エマニュエル両名誉会長を歓迎する会では、350名のご出席者を得て大規模なリアルイベントの復活を宣言することができました。今後ともリアルイベントの復活を進める所存ですが、この機会に会員の皆様の当協会への日頃のご支援に感謝し、2021年度の活動実績を報告いたします。

1) プログラムの実施状況

2021年度に開催したプログラムの詳細は **Calendar of Event (P10-13)** をご覧ください。

各界から著名なゲストスピーカーをお招きする月例会については、2020年3月までは **White & Case** 法律事務所のご厚意により会場を提供頂いておりましたが、リアル開催による感染リスクが完全に否定できない状況下では、本年開催の月例会9件は全てオンラインでの開催となりました。開催の時間帯に柔軟性を持たせたことやオンライン参加への習熟から出席数は160人を超えることもあり、広くタイムリーに生きた情報を会員間に共有できるイベントになりました。今後のリアル化推進にあたってはオンライン開催の長所も生かした組合せを追求したいと考えています。なお、いずれのイベントに於いても、従来と同様に大井隆理事には同時通訳サービスのご提供につきご支援頂いておりますこと、この場を借りて御礼申し上げます。

この他に、会員の交流を広める企画として、総会後の懇親会、米大使館公邸でのパーティー、在日米商工会議所との共催の「飲む・ニケーション」、米軍基地見学会、競馬観戦などを一昨年末まで実行してきましたが、感染症拡大防止対策からゴルフ大会(2021年11月実施の岸会長杯)を除き、全てキャンセルの止むなきに至っております。会場側の都合もあるため一気にリアル化するのは難しいですが、できるところから少しずつ取組んで参ります。

これに加えて、100周年記念行事は、新型コロナウイルス拡大の影響により金子聖太郎賞の選考、**VSJ** プログラムによる米国人研究者の日本招聘は中止となりました。特にアメリカボウル大会はオンラインとの組合せによるハイブリッド開催を目指しましたが、準備の整った予選会の直前に緊急事態宣言が発出されたため中止となったのは残念でした。唯一、日米の若人により時事討論を行う **NGRT** のみ感染症の状況を見つつ一部は森ビル様のご支援によって2021年10月以降はリアルセッションを復活させております。

2) 会員の状況

P-14 に示した通り、新型コロナウイルスの影響で法人会員3社が退会、1社が休会、1社が入会となりました。個人会員については、学生会員数は増えましたが、維持・正・準の各会員は減少し、会費収入は全体で減少となっています。一方、学生会員の増加は、2020年から導入した **NGRT** 参加希望者への入会時のプログラム参加費免除、学生会員年会費の値引き(3千円から2千円)に依るもので、若人の参加による協会活動の活性化に寄与するものと期待しています。

会員の皆様に個人会員の入会を引続きお願いすると共に、米人の個人会員の構成比は依然 11%に留まっております。

め、特に米人会員の入会にご支援くださるよう改めてお願い申し上げます。

3) 役員について

当協会の役員（理事・監事）は定款第5章第18条により「理事9名以上13名以内（任期2年）、監事2名以内（任期4年）」と定められております。今年度は、理事13名中11名が今総会で任期を迎えますので、今総会の議案として重任の承認をお諮り致します。ご承認頂きますと、今回重任を受けた11名を含めた再任理事は13名、監事は2名となります。尚、今年度に退任する理事・監事はおりません。

名誉会長については、2022年1月のラーム・エマニュエル米国駐日大使の着任を受けて、4月に名誉会長に就任頂きました。尚、長らく協会顧問を努められた渡邊五郎顧問が2021年2月にご逝去されました。協会活動へのご理解とご支援に改めて深く感謝すると共に衷心よりご冥福をお祈りいたします。P8-9をご覧ください。

4) 財務・経理の状況

収支の状況は、①通常の一般事業と②100周年記念事業に分けて報告します。

- ① 一般事業の状況：P-15に記述の通り、昨年度の黒字(524千円)から大幅な黒字(10,516千円)となりました。これはひとえに2020年12月に逝去された谷静子評議員の遺贈10,000千円に依るものであり、改めて谷評議員の御遺志に深謝すると共に、同資金は谷静子基金として御遺志に沿うべく日米の若人育成のため大切に使用させて頂き、今後は総会にて報告させて頂きます。この他、収入面では若手会員は増加したものの法人会員4社と個人正会員の退会増がマイナス要因となりましたが、それを上回る経費削減によって黒字(516千円)を維持することができました。
- ② 100周年記念事業の状況：P-16に記載の通り、会員の皆様より頂戴した「100周年記念基金」を大切に使い4つの記念事業を推進の結果、2021年度には3,159千円を消費し期末での残額は80,611千円となっております。

5) 100周年事業について

頂戴したご寄附は特に日米相互理解と友好促進を進めるため、さらには日米の若人の国際交流を支援するための以下の4つのプログラムに使用してまいりました。2021年度の実績と決算はP-16、2022年度の予算はP-22をご参照ください。

① 日米協会金子堅太郎賞

同賞は日米交流に草の根レベルで貢献した一般人を対象とする賞です。選考委員会は委員長を齊藤邦彦元駐米大使（当協会名誉副会長）に、委員には茂木キッコーマン名誉会長、大橋ANAホールディングス相談役、ラフルアー在日米商工会議所会長（当協会副会長）、ジャーナリストの国谷裕子氏、久保文明防衛大学校長、日米協会を代表して小職を委員としています。2020年度は、表彰対象者の選考対象を厚くするため当初から一時中断を計画致しましたが、2021年度も新型コロナウイルスの拡大に歯止めが掛かっておらず、公募や推薦過程への影響が避けられないことから選考を中止し、2022年度に第4回金子賞の選考再開を予定しています。

② NGRT（Next Generation Round-table in Tokyo）

次世代向けのプロジェクトの目玉として、「次世代ラウンドテーブル in TOKYO (NGRT)」を実施しています。東京でアメリカ人と英語で議論する場を作り、日米両国の若人のネットワーキングを図ることを狙いとしています。年間を通じ10回程度を六本木ヒルズクラブ（会場ご提供：森ビル）にて行い、米人をはじめ企業会員の若手社員や若い個人会員からも多数の参加を得ております。

2021年10月から第5期生によるプログラムとして4月末まで5回実施していますが、少人数によるセッションであるためリアル開催としています。毎回各界の新進気鋭のスピーカーをお招きすることで活発な議論が展開されています。2020年募集の第4期生より40歳未満の会員への参加を無料とすることで若手の会員増に直結する制度と致し、若人の会員増にも貢献しています。

③ Visit and Study Japan Grant Program (VSJ)

米国の大学院で日本研究を行っている米国人学生の短期日本研究訪問の助成金プログラムです。別途選抜された米国の大学院生に日米協会から奨学金、外務省の助成による渡航費を援助します。2020年度は新型コロナウイルスによる影響でプログラム自体が中止となりましたが、2021年度は合格者2名を出したものの1名は辞退、1名は2022年秋に来日時期を延長して受け入れることとなりました。

④ アメリカボウル大会

アメリカボウル大会は、日本人高校生を対象に、アメリカの歴史・文化・芸術・地理・科学・日米関係などについての知識を簡単な英語で問うクイズ大会です。米国のワシントン DC 日米協会が永年開催しているジャパン・ボウルの経験を活かしてアメリカ人と日本人合わせて15名程度の準備委員会を構成し、準備を進めましたが、2020年度は中止、2021年度もオンラインでの予選大会と小規模・少人数での決勝戦を組合せる構成で準備を進めましたが、予選大会直前に緊急事態宣言発令となったため中止と致しました。

Annual Report FY2021
For the fiscal year ended April 30, 2022

Dear Members of the Society,

As the impact of the pandemic by Covid-19 remained strong in FY2021, particularly by the prolonged declaration of a state of emergency and subsequent quasi declarations, all but a few of the regular meetings and events, including the Annual General Meeting, had to be held online or cancelled. Nevertheless, the total number of events, including the centennial commemorative events, reached 28, slightly lower than the 31 held in FY2021.

On the other hand, it is good news that the said pandemic is expected to subside due to the expansion of vaccinations and other measures. That was realized by the ceremonial event held on June at the Grand Hyatt Tokyo to welcome Honorary Presidents Shinzo Abe and Rahm Emanuel, which was attended by approximately 350 people. We will continue to promote the revival of real events in the very near future, and we would like to take this opportunity to thank our members for their ongoing support of our association and report on the results of our activities in FY2021.

Firstly, the following are the summary of our activities in FY 2021.

Please see the Calendar of Events (p. 10-13) for details on the programs held in FY2021.

As for the monthly meetings with distinguished guest speakers from various fields, the White & Case law firm had kindly provided us with a venue until March 2020, but under circumstances where the risk of infection from holding a real event was unable to be completely ruled out, all nine monthly meetings held this year were held online. The flexibility of timeslots and familiarity with online operation has resulted in the increase of attendance exceeding 160 people in some cases, making it an event where live information can be shared among members who attend in person. In the future, we would like to pursue a combination that takes advantage of both online and real events for our events. We would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr. Takashi Oi, director of the AJS, for his continued support in providing simultaneous interpretation services at all of our events.

In addition to the above, we have been diligently carrying out various events to promote exchanges among members, such as a get-together after the General Meeting, a party at the official residence of the U.S. Embassy, a "Nomu-nucation" jointly sponsored with the American Chamber of Commerce in Japan, a tour of an American military base, and horse races, until the year before last. However, due to measures to prevent the spread of infectious diseases, we have had to cancel all of these events except for the golf tournament (President Kishi Cup in November

2021). It may be difficult to make it realize in person at once due to the circumstances of the venues, but we will work on it little by little, starting from where we can.

In addition to the above, concerning the centennial events, the selection of the Kentaro Kaneko Award and the invitation of American researchers to Japan under the VSJ program have been cancelled due to the pandemic. Besides, it was particularly regrettable that the America Bowl quiz competition, which we had hoped to hold as a hybrid event by combining it with the online competition, was cancelled due to the declaration of a state of emergency just before the preliminary round. Only the NGRT program, where young people from Japan and the U.S. discuss current topics, has been partially resurrected as a real session since October 2021 with the support of Mori Building.

Secondly, regarding the number of AJS members as shown, we had to see off 3 corporate members and permit one corporate member suspend membership for a while both relating to the pandemic, while one company joined. As for individual members, the number of student members increased, but the number of sustainable, regular, and associate members decreased, resulting in an overall decrease in membership fee revenue. On the other hand, the increase in student members is attributed to the program fee waiver for those who wish to join NGRT and the reduction of annual student member fees (from 3,000 yen to 2,000 yen) introduced in 2020, which has been contributed to the revitalization of the association's activities through the participation of younger people.

I would like to reiterate my request to our members to continue to support the new admission of individual members, especially American members, as they still account for only 11% of the total membership.

Thirdly, with regard to the officers of the Society, in accordance with Chapter 5, Article 18 of the articles of association, the number of officers should be at least 9 and up to 13 directors for a term of two years. In addition to the above, there is a maximum of 2 auditors for a term of four years. This year, 11 members of the Board of Directors will be termed out and hence need reappointments at the general meeting. If they are approved, the total number of directors is 13, including the said reappointed directors, there are 2 auditors, and no retiring directors and auditors.

The U.S. Ambassador to Japan Rahm Emanuel was appointed, as the Honorary President of the AJS in April, following his inauguration as the Ambassador to Japan in January 2022.

Meanwhile we would like to express our deepest gratitude for the late Mr. Goro Watanabe, who had served as an advisor of the AJS for a long time and passed away in February 2021. Other Honorary Vice Presidents and Advisors will continue to serve as the same as before. Please refer to P8-9.

The fourth theme is about finance and accounting, the details of revenue and expenditure are reported in two categories: regular general operations and centennial commemorative operations. The status of income and expenditures is reported separately for (1) regular general operations and (2) 100th anniversary projects.

(1) Status of regular general operations:

As described on P-15, there was a significant surplus (10,516 thousand yen) from the surplus (524 thousand yen) in the previous year. This is mainly due to the bequest of 10,000 thousand yen from the late Ms. Shizuko Tani, who passed away in December 2020. We would like to express our deepest gratitude to her will, and we will use this fund carefully as the Shizuko Tani Fund for the development of young people in Japan and the United States in accordance with her will, which we will report at the Annual Meeting.

In terms of income, although the number of young members increased, the withdrawal of three corporate members and an individual regular member were negative factors, but cost reductions more than offset these factors to maintain a surplus (516,000 yen).

As described on page 16, we carefully used the "Centennial Fund" received from our members to promote four commemorative projects, and as a result, 3,159 thousand yen was expended in FY2021, leaving a balance of 80,611 thousand yen at the end of the term.

(2) The Centennial Donations have been used for the following four programs to promote mutual understanding and friendship between Japan and the U.S., and to support international exchange between young people in Japan and the U.S. Please refer to P-16 for FY2021 results and accounts and P-22 for FY2022 budget.

i) The Kaneko Award

The Kaneko Award is given to an individual who has made a grassroots contribution to U.S.-Japan relations. The selection committee is chaired by former Ambassador to the U.S. Mr. Kunihiko Saito (Honorary Vice President of the Association) and includes Mr. Yuzaburo Mogi, Honorary Chairman of Kikkoman, Mr. Yoji Ohashi, Senior Advisor of ANA Holdings, Mr. Christopher LaFleur of the American Chamber of Commerce in Japan (Vice President of the AJS), journalist Ms. Yuko Kuniya, Dr. Fumiaki Kubo, President of the National Defense Academy. We had temporarily suspended the selection of award recipients in FY2020 in order to increase the number of candidates to be deliberately selected for the award, but we had to suspend the selection process in FY2021 because of the pandemic. The selection of the 4th Kaneko Award is scheduled to be resumed in FY2022.

ii) NGRT (Next Generation Round-table in Tokyo)

The "Next Generation Round-table in Tokyo (NGRT)" is the centerpiece of the project for the next generation. The idea is to create a forum in Tokyo for discussion with Americans in English, and the NGRT aims to promote networking between young Americans and Japanese through the

series of session. The NGRT is held approximately 10 times throughout the year at Roppongi Hills Clubs, the venue benevolently provided by Messrs. Mori Building, and has been well attended by both Americans, young individual members and young employees of corporate members.

Starting in October 2021 at this year, the program has been held five times until the end of April as the 5th program. As the sessions were held in relatively small groups, they could be held in person and hence be lively inviting up-and-coming speakers from various fields. From the fourth intake, we have exempted the admission fee for the AJS member, which directly increase the number of Associate and Student members.

iii) Visit and Study Japan Grant Program (VSJ)

The Visit and Study Japan Grant Program (VSJ) provides grants for short-term study visits to Japan for U.S. students pursuing Japanese studies at U.S. graduate schools.

In FY2020, the program itself was cancelled due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, but in FY2021, two students were accepted, with one declined later, but the other was scheduled to apply for the program by extending the visit in the fall of 2022.

iv) America Bowl

The America Bowl is a quiz competition for Japanese high school students to test their knowledge of American history, culture, art, geography, science, and Japan-U.S. relations in simple English. The Japan-America Society of Washington, D.C., in the U.S. has long held the Japan Bowl, and a preparatory committee of about 15 American and Japanese members was formed to prepare for the event. However, due to a state of emergency declared just before the preliminary round, the event was abruptly cancelled. The event has been and will be supported by: U.S.-Japan Foundation, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, U.S. Embassy, ZEN-Eiren, Japan-America Society of Washington DC, the Institute for International Business Communication, Association for the Promotion of International Education, the Japan Society for International Education and the Education Committee of Minato City in Tokyo.

We will continue to be yet more active for the benefit of our members this year and look forward to your continued understanding and support. We look forward to your continued understanding and support.

Direction for strengthening the Society's Events

A: Regular Programs

1) Talk events: lectures and panels.

Inviting prominent guests for lectures, talks and dialogs with President Fujisaki on the timely subjects nearly every month. While most of the events in 2021 were held online, we will pursue opportunities for switching them to "real" ones as the circumstances should get improved.
